



Hill Country Film Festival and Fritztown Cinema to Screen 6 MONTH RULE

Monthly Series Features Free Screening of Indie Feature Film

AUSTIN, Texas (Aug. 29, 2014) – The [Hill Country Film Festival](#) (HCFF), an annual independent film event in Fredericksburg, Texas, held in late April, and presented by the Hill Country Film Society, has partnered with [Fritztown Cinema](#) to promote the art of independent filmmaking through a monthly “indie screening series” in Fredericksburg.

WHAT: The eighth film presentation of the collaborative efforts of HCFF and Fritztown Cinema is [6 MONTH RULE](#) (d. Blayne Weaver, U.S., 2011). This romantic dramedy revolves around a bachelor who follows a set of rules in order to avoid emotional attachment, the most important being: there is no woman so perfect that you can’t get over her in six months.

The film delivers a romantic, charming, and poignant look at relationships, seen from the eyes of Tyler (Weaver), who lives by a philosophy that allows him to avoid making any significant connections with women. His best friend (Martin Starr) has just become Tyler’s pet project as he tries to teach his buddy about the joys of cold-hearted bachelorhood. However, he discovers that no philosophy is set in stone when he keeps bumping into a fascinating woman.
