



**Hill Country Film Festival Announces Initial Six Official Selections for 2015 Fest
Screenings Including Dramatic Feature Film *SUNNY IN THE DARK* and Cannes
International Film Festival World Premiere *OH LUCY!***

AUSTIN, Texas (March 10, 2015) – The Hill Country Film Festival (HCFF), presented by the Hill Country Film Society, announced six official selections for its upcoming independent film event held in the heart of the Texas Hill Country, Fredericksburg, Texas, April 30 – May 3, 2015.

The sixth annual festival will screen more than 90 independent films, host filmmaker Q&A sessions, panel discussions, festival parties, community screenings, and more. The full festival line-up will be announced March 30, 2015.

The six selections include feature film [SUNNY IN THE DARK](#) (d. Courtney Ware, U.S., 2015) and short films [ANOTHER DAY GONE BY](#) (d. Daniel Angeles, U.S., 2014); [A TROPICAL SUNDAY](#) (d. Fabian Ribezzo, Mozambique, 2014); [THE OCEANMAKER](#) (d. Lucas Martell, U.S., 2014); and [OH LUCY!](#) (d. Atsuko Hirayanagi, Japan, 2014). A special screening of the documentary **SEC READY** (d. Lindsay Crouch, U.S., 2014) will also be presented.

“HCFF strives to create an environment every year that directly aligns with our goals of educating and inspiring the next generation of filmmakers and promoting the art, craft, and business of independent film production,” said Chad Mathews, executive director, HCFFS. “With the quality and number of film submissions increasing annually, we’re excited for the 2015 festival and look forward to share the world of independent filmmaking.”
