



Hill Country Film Society and Fritztown Cinema to Screen **POWER'S WAR**

Monthly Series Features Free Screening of Indie Documentary Film

AUSTIN, Texas (July 31, 2015) – The [Hill Country Film Festival](#) (HCFF), an annual independent film event in Fredericksburg, Texas (April 28 – May 1, 2016) and presented by the Hill Country Film Society, has partnered with [Fritztown Cinema](#) to screen [POWER'S WAR](#) (d. Cameron Trejo, U.S., 2015), as part of its monthly “indie screening series” in Fredericksburg.

WHAT: The 15th film presentation of the collaborative efforts of the Hill Country Film Society and Fritztown Cinema is **POWER'S WAR**. This feature documentary provides an in depth look at one man's silent protest against the first World War which turned into the deadliest shootout in Arizona's history.

On the evening of February 9, 1918, three local lawmen and one federal officer rode into the Arizona wilderness to apprehend four men on counts of draft evasion and murder. The violence that followed has been so steeped in legend, lies, and hearsay, that the facts of what occurred at that remote cabin and why were almost lost to history. Contemporary interviews with historians and family members, archival footage, and original artwork tell the story of the events leading up to and following the deadliest shootout in Arizona's history.

Director Cameron Trejo and historian Mark Weitz will be attendance and will participate in Q&A following the screening.
