to Screen DANCER, TEXAS POP. 81**

Monthly Series Features Free Screening of Texas-made Independent Film

AUSTIN, Texas (Sept. 1, 2015) – The [Hill Country Film Festival](#) (HCFF), an annual independent film event in Fredericksburg, Texas (April 28 – May 1, 2016) and presented by the Hill Country Film Society, has partnered with [Fritztown Cinema](#) to screen [DANCER, TEXAS POP. 81](#) (d. Tim McCanlies, U.S., 1998), as part of its monthly “indie screening series” in Fredericksburg.

WHAT: The 16th film presentation of the collaborative efforts of the Hill Country Film Society and Fritztown Cinema is **DANCER, TEXAS POP. 81**. Originally released in 1998, film reviewer Joe M. O’Connell, writing for the *San Antonio Express-News*, described the film as “The finest representation of small-town Texas since *The Last Picture Show*.”

Four best friends are about to graduate from high school in their tiny West Texas town with a longstanding pact to escape their small-world upbringing and head for Los Angeles once they get their diplomas. Although each boy has dreamt of a more exciting life elsewhere, all struggle to take the plunge, especially as the townspeople try to convince them all to stay.
