## **Film Affäre Explores Convergence of Food and Film with Award-Winning Filmmaker and Food Nerd Tom Provost**

### ***Fundraiser Supports Hill Country Film Society***

**AUSTIN, Texas (Jan. 18, 2016)** – The [Hill Country Film Society](#), a non-profit organization dedicated to fostering, encouraging and promoting independent film production, is partnering with [Hoffman Haus](#), [Otto's German Bistro](#) and [Pedernales Cellars](#) for [Film Affäre](#), a cinematic and culinary journey, to be held Friday, Feb. 19, 2016, at 6:30 p.m. in the Great Hall at Hoffman Haus, 608 East Creek Street, Fredericksburg, Texas.

The evening will be hosted by Tom Provost, filmmaker, chef and author of the highly respected blog, [On Food and Film](#), and creator and instructor of the popular filmmaking series [Cinema Language](#). He will share his insights and experiences on how food can influence our perspective of cinema and vice versa. The experience will encompass five small courses prepared by Chef Adam Yoho at Otto's German Bistro, Pedernales Cellars wine, and film – all inspired and paired with Provost's film inspiration.

His film **PRESENCE** (d. Tom Provost, U.S., 2011) screened at the inaugural Hill Country Film Festival in 2010 and later went on to be picked up by film production and distribution studio Lionsgate Films and aired on HBO.

“We believe Film Affäre will leave attendees with a greater appreciation of the role of food in film and create an experience that truly educates, inspires and engages,” said Wade Lee, director, for Hill Country Film Society. “We’re also excited to be partnering with names synonymous with incredible hospitality and award-winning food and wine in the Hill Country – Hoffman Haus, Otto’s and Pedernales Cellars.”

The evening will include locally sourced foods for delectable bites from Otto's German Bistro paired with a variety Texas Hill Country wines from Pedernales Cellars. The program will conclude with dessert and coffee.
