AIN'T THEM BODIES SAINTS**

Monthly Series Features Free Screening of Independent Film

AUSTIN, Texas (July 5, 2017) – The Hill Country Film Society, a non-profit organization committed to providing year-round independent film programming and education in the Texas Hill Country and host to the annual Hill Country Country Film Festival in Fredericksburg, Texas, on April 26-29, 2018, has partnered with [Fritztown Cinema](#) to host a screening of the feature film [AIN'T THEM BODIES SAINTS](#) (d. David Lowery, U.S.) as part of its “indie film series” in Fredericksburg.

WHAT: **AIN'T THEM BODIES SAINTS** is a romantic crime drama starring Casey Affleck as Bob Muldoon, Rooney Mara as Ruth Guthrie, and Ben Foster as Patrick Wheeler. Bob (Affleck) and Ruth (Mara) are a couple who become involved in criminal activities and are caught with Bob taking the blame and going to prison. Ruth gives birth to their daughter and the two live comfortably. When the child is nearly four, Bob escapes from jail and goes looking to reconnect with his family.

Sundance Film Festival awarded the film the Indian Paintbrush Producer's Award and the Special Jury Prize for Cinematography in 2013. Lowery was recently reviewed as a Texas filmmaker on the rise by [Texas Monthly](#).
