to Screen Sundance Award Winning Feature Film
WINTER'S BONE**

Monthly Series Features Free Screening of Independent Film

AUSTIN, Texas (Sept. 8, 2017) – The Hill Country Film Society, a non-profit organization committed to providing year-round independent film programming and education in the Texas Hill Country and host to the annual Hill Country Country Film Festival in Fredericksburg, Texas, on April 26-29, 2018, has partnered with [Fritztown Cinema](#) to host a screening of the feature film WINTER'S BONE (d. Debra Granik, U.S.) as part of its "indie film series" in Fredericksburg.

WHAT: [WINTER'S BONE](#) follows the story of seventeen-year-old Ree Dolly (played by Jennifer Lawrence), who struggles to keep her family together despite an absent father and a withdrawn and depressed mother. She is taken aback when the local sheriff informs her that her father put up their house as collateral for his bail. Unless he shows up for his trial in a week's time, they will lose it all. Determined to find him, she doggedly questions her father's relatives and associates, but everywhere she goes the message is the same: stay out of it or get hurt. Refusing to listen, she pushes on putting her own life in danger for the sake of her family until the truth, or enough of it, is revealed.

Sundance Film Festival awarded the film the Grand Jury Prize: Dramatic Film and the Best Screenplay Award in 2010.
