



Hill Country Film Society and Fritztown Cinema to Screen Documentary A SINGLE FRAME

AUSTIN, Texas (August 5, 2018) – The Hill Country Film Society, a non-profit organization committed to providing year-round independent film programming and education in the Texas Hill Country and host to the annual [Hill Country Film Festival](#) in Fredericksburg, Texas, on April 25-28, 2019, has partnered with [Fritztown Cinema](#) to host a screening of [A SINGLE FRAME](#) (d. Brandon Dickerson, U.S.) as part of Indie Film Series.

WHAT: While on a trip to Dubrovnik in 2007, Jeff Bowden encounters a photograph of a refugee child taken during the war in Kosovo. Driven by this haunting image, Bowden sets out to find the boy. His journey takes him from Texas to Paris, and ultimately to the post-war culture of the Balkans, where he combines forces with an experienced war-time fixer. Weaving together the stories of the war, the now-deceased photojournalist, Alexandra Boulat, and the search for the boy, A SINGLE FRAME is a testament to the power of photography and to the belief that every life matters.
