

Hill Country Film Society and Hoffman Haus to Screen Texas-made film BUCK ALAMO

AUSTIN, Texas (Apr. 24, 203) – The Hill Country Film Society, a non-profit organization committed to providing year-round independent film programming and education in the Texas Hill Country and host to the annual Hill Country Film Festival in Fredericksburg, Texas, on June 1-4, 2023, has partnered with <u>Hoffman Haus</u> to host a screening of BUCK ALAMO (d. Ben Epstein, U.S.). The screening is part of the society's <u>Indie Film Series</u>.

WHAT: BUCK ALAMO is a Texas-made independent film that won the Audience

Award at the 2021 Austin Film Festival.

Unloading its existential chamber like a Texas folk song, BUCK ALAMO is a dramatic, dreamlike western about a modern-day musical Outlaw (the great Sonny Carl Davis) as he duels with Death (voiced by the legendary Bruce Dern).
